Supporting Students Affected by COVID-19

With support from the Lego Foundation, the Global Fund for Children launched the Partnership to Educate All Kids (PEAK), with a goal of providing financial support to at least 65 community based organizations in at 12 countries, and reach at least 100,000 children facing barriers to education due to COVID-19.



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Facilitating Connections

Connective Impact referred the Global Fund for Children to the African Education Program (AEP), and their local implementing partner, Amos Youth Centre (AYC), in Zambia to evaluate potential partnership opportunities.

Rapid Partnership

After the Global Fund for Children met with AEP's local partner, a two year partnership was launched to sustain AEP's holistic approach to education and youth development under the PEAK program.
